The National Safety Stand-Down to Prevent Falls in Construction is May 3 – 7, 2021. The Stand-Down aims to raise fall hazard awareness in an effort to stop fatalities and injuries from falls. It is a voluntary event for employers to talk directly to employees about safety. Any workplace can hold a stand-down by taking a break to focus on Fall Hazards and reinforcing the importance of Fall Prevention.

Agencies with employees who work at heights greater than 4 feet on ladders, in bucket trucks or scissor lifts, on roofs or tops of trucks, or adjacent to deep pits, can conduct a Safety Stand-Down by providing Safety Briefings or other safety activities such as conducting safety equipment inspections, developing rescue plans, or discussing job specific hazards. Managers are encouraged to plan a Stand-Down that works best for their workplace.
